# Out of Home half year results for 2020

The Out of Home (OOH) industry today announced half year net media revenue results including the category breakdowns for 2020.

Total net media revenue was \$289.1 million, down 35.4% from \$447.3 million for the same period in 2019\*. Change was noted across the following categories:

## Category figures 2020^^:

•	Roadside Billboards (over and under 25 square metres)	\$129.7 million
•	Roadside Other (street furniture, bus/tram externals, small format)	\$78.0 million
•	Transport (including airports)	\$44.1 million
•	^Retail, Lifestyle and Other	\$37.3 million

# Category figures 2019\*:

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•	Roadside Billboards (over and under 25 square metres)	\$176.8 million	
•	Roadside Other (street furniture, bus/tram externals,	\$126.1 million	
	small format)		
•	Transport (including airports)	\$82.6 million	
•	^Retail, Lifestyle and Other	\$61.8 million	

Digital Out of Home (DOOH) revenue accounts for 55.7% of total net media revenue year-to-date, an increase over the recorded 54.0%\* for the same period last year.

Please note that the OMA Board has reviewed its reporting requirements and, given industry changes, will be reverting back to releasing category results quarterly.

## Editor's note on how figures are calculated:

The Outdoor Media Association (OMA) estimates that it represents approximately 80% of the Out of Home (OOH) industry in Australia. Figures provided in this media release are net figures (exclusive of commission, production and installation). Figures represent advertiser campaigns posted in each quarter. Figures also include all direct sales which are estimated at 10% of total bookings.

#### About the OMA

The OMA is the peak industry body which represents most of Australia's Outdoor Media Display companies and production facilities, and some Media Display asset owners.

The OMA operates nationally and prior to July 2005 traded as the Outdoor Advertising Association of Australia (OAAA). It was first incorporated in 1939.

The OMA's charter is to serve its members by promoting the Out of Home industry and developing constructive relations with its primary stakeholders. Its core functions are Marketing and Research (including audience measurement), Government Relations and Regulatory Affairs, Media Relations, and Member Services.

The OMA is governed by a Board of Directors which is elected by the membership.
